Celebrating 150 Years at Motor

This coming year at Motor, we are celebrating a very special anniversary for the mill. December 2019 marks Motor Mill's 150th anniversary and we will be commemorating it by having a yearlong celebration throughout 2020. The historic site has experienced and gone through many changes during its lifetime but still lives on. Clayton County Conservation and the Motor Mill Foundation plan to make the Mill's 150th year an exciting one and look forward to further educating the public about the site's rich and historic background!

John Thompson, James Crosby and J.P. Dickinson's plans for the greatest gristmill of the Midwest have lived on through Motor Mill's beautiful and sturdy construction. With construction beginning in 1867 and finishing in 1869 with the completion of the roof, Motor Mill was thought by Thompson to be a sort of eighth wonder of the world and "more beautiful than the Taj Mahal." Though it was used as an active mill for only about 13 years, Motor Mill has managed to capture the fascination and respect of all that experience it.
