OLD BUSINESS

- 1 STABLE PROJECT Pollock reported that the old concrete has been removed. Josh Everitt, the concrete contactor, said that a few inches would have to be cut off the bottom of the large doors to clear the concrete apron that will be installed. The latest report from Dale Kittleson is that he hopes to begin work in late August.
- 2 TURBINES Chris Schoen has shared an emailed photo from the Maryland laboratory showing the dismantling of a turbine.

3 – INN PROJECT – Pollock said the Community Thrives effort so far has raised \$4,025 online via Mighty Cause, plus \$3310 in other donations. We may be eligible for additional money from Mighty Cause because we scored in the upper one-fourth of applicants.

Pollock has submitted a grant application to Upper Mississippi Gaming.

She is seeking letters of support from Clayton County businesses to submit August 24 with the Community Attractions and Tourism (CAT) grant application.

Conservation Board employee Kenny Slocum tentatively plans to play for a "date night" fund raising concert at the Stable on September 30. Turkey River Farm will offer hors d'oeuvres.

Paula Mohr, with the State Historic Preservation Office, has offered to donate a number of Motor Mill art prints by her late father, Wendell Mohr.

- 4 VISITS TO MILLS? Zichal will be away several weeks in September, but he will try to contact Pickwick Mill and Schech's Mill to consider possible options for us to visit when the mills are operating.
- 5 RENOVATIONS PHOTOS –Stone has nothing new to report on locating "before and after" photos. Nikolai suggested arranging photos in 5-year increments.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1 RESOLUTION FOR SILOS AND SMOKESTACKS GRANT Morine moved to pass a resolution of support to apply for a Silos and Smokestacks National Heritage Area large program award for the Inn project. Yackel-Juleen seconded. Roll call vote: Morine, Nikolai, Zichal, Slagel, Yackel-Juleen, and Stone all voted aye. No one opposed. Carried unanimously.
- 2 SALE OF TURBINE TUBS Zichal moved to approve the sale of the used turbine tubs to Diana Elsinger for \$100 each, or 50% of the new price. Stone seconded. Carried.

- 1 TRRC The TRRC committee did not meet in August.
- 2 INFRARED TRAIL COUNTERS Pollock reported that she's still trying to fine-tune the counters on the Motor Mill trail to get accurate results that are not affected by environmental conditions.

UPDATES

The Conservation Board has signed an updated Partner Site Memorandum of Understanding with Silos and Smokestacks National Heritage Area.

The Board thanked Pollock for her grant writing efforts and success.

Zichal moved to adjourn at 8:35 p.m. Stone seconded. Carried.
